 1. 2008 Girls Volleyball Roster – Due Wednesday, October 22, 2008
 2. 2008 Boys Volleyball Roster – Due Wednesday, October 16, 2008
 3. NHIAA Tournament Awards Roster (if applicable)

All forms can be accessed through a “Forms” link in the athletic directors administration area of the NHIAA website. Once accessed and filled out, please email the forms to dplumb@nhiaa.org. DO NOT FOLLOW UP WITH HARD COPIES!

3. All coaches need to be enrolled in order to take over in the event the head coach is disqualified. If there are no other enrolled coaches available to take over, the game is forfeited.
4. **CLARIFICATION ON LIBERO TRACKER:**
 - *Regular Season Libero Tracking: The home team will provide an official scorer and Libero tracker to track the Libero players for both teams at all regular season games.
 - *Tournament Libero Tracking: The NHIAA will provide an official scorer and Libero tracker for all semifinal and final rounds of the volleyball tournament. For the preliminary and quarterfinal rounds, the higher seeded team will provide an official scorer and Libero tracker to track the Libero player for both teams.
 - *Note: If in the event the home team cannot provide a Libero tracker the visiting team may provide a Libero tracker for the match.
5. All tournaments, jamborees, festivals and similar competition in volleyball must be sanctioned by the Volleyball Committee of the NHIAA. All such contests sanctioned by the Committee shall not count on the regular season's record for tournament consideration. No school may enter more than one approved Columbus Day tournament. Please refer to By-Law Article VII Sanctioning, Sect. 3: Intrastate Competition.
6. TRAINERS – Schools requesting medical services are to provide the necessary supplies for the trainer at all regular season and tournament events.
7. **Infectious Disease Notification:**
In the event that a school has an athlete(s) that has been diagnosed with an infectious disease (i.e. MRSA/Staph infection), the Athletic Director must notify the school nurse, the NHIAA and all other opposing school teams on their schedule.
8. **TOURNAMENT MATCH START TIMES:** Tournament match times will NOT be altered unless the first match runs into the start time of the second match.

9. **NFHS Libero Serving** – The NFHS has adopted Rule 6-3-2e (new), which allows the libero to serve in one position in the serving order. Below, please find all pertinent information regarding proper procedures and play situation.

Allowing the Libero to Serve**

Procedure:

1. The libero and the replacement must enter or leave the court in the libero replacement zone, over the sideline between the attack line and the end line. (See court diagram)
2. A team is assessed an unnecessary delay for improper libero replacement procedures.
3. In one rotation, the libero can replace the player in the service position and serve the next rally even if he/she is already on the court in replacement of another back row player.
4. In this situation, the libero does not have to exit the court before replacing the player in the service position.
5. The coach is not required to indicate on the lineup sheet the position where the libero will serve. At any point in the game, the coach can determine the position where the libero will serve by simply having the libero replace that server.
6. Once the libero serves in a particular position in a game, that is the **only** position where the libero is allowed to serve. However, the libero is not required to serve in that position for all subsequent rotations. The starting player, a legal substitute, or the libero can serve any rally that takes place whenever that position is in the service position.
7. The scorer must record on the score sheet when the libero serves during each game. The assistant scorer must record the position where the libero serves on the Libero Tracking Sheet as well.
(See “Directions for Scorer and Libero Tracker”)

Libero Play Situations When Allowed to Serve

Situation 1: When the lineup is submitted before a game, the umpire and/or scorer notice that there is no indication of the position where the libero will serve.

Ruling: Legal. **Comment:** The coach is not required to indicate on the lineup sheet where the libero will serve. At any point in the game, the decision can be made to have the libero replace the server. However, once the libero serves in one rotation, he/she is restricted to serve in **only** that rotation.

Situation 2: The libero for Team R has not yet served in the current game. The libero has replaced player No. 8 and is playing in the back row. Team R wins a rally and rotates, moving player No. 2 to the serving position (position No. 1). The libero goes to the service area, player No. 2 exits the court over the sideline between the attack line and end line, and player No. 8 returns to the court.

Ruling: Legal. **Comment:** These player replacements are allowed. There does not have to be a rally between libero replacements if the libero serves the next rally.

Situation 3: The libero for Team S has replaced player No. 3 in position No. 1 and has served two points. Player No. 3 returns to the game to replace the libero and serve the next rally. The libero stays on the court in replacement of another back-row player, No. 7. Player No. 7 exits the court.

Ruling: Illegal. **Comment:** This is an illegal libero replacement. A rally must take place between two libero replacements, unless the libero serves the next rally. If the officials must intercede to correct the situation, an unnecessary delay is assessed the team. If the next serve is contacted before the illegal replacement is identified, illegal alignment results.

Situation 4: The Team S libero is in the warm-up area, and has not served in this game. Before the referee authorizes service, while player No. 7 is in the service area, the coach instructs the libero to serve for No. 7. The libero and No. 7 exchange positions at the end of the court – neither player crosses the sideline between the attack line and the end line.

Ruling: Illegal. **Comment:** The players involved in a libero replacement must enter and exit the court over the sideline between the attack line and the end line so that the umpire can ensure that the proper notations are made by the scorers. Failure to do so results in an unnecessary delay. Even when an unnecessary delay is assessed, the replacement is allowed provided the libero enters legally.

Situation 5: The Team S libero has served in the current game in position three (in replacement of starting player No.2). Later in the same game, the libero enters from the bench (having sat out one rally) and prepares to serve in position six (in replacement of starting player No.7). The officials are aware that the libero cannot serve in this second position, but how should they handle the situation?

Ruling: The libero replacement itself is legal, so nothing illegal occurs unless the libero actually serves the ball. Treat this situation as any other potential wrong server. The scorer and officials should wait until the service contact is made before assessing a penalty for serving out of order. Once the penalty is assessed, the libero can remain on the court in replacement of No.7 if the team desires, as a rally has occurred.

Situation 6: The Team S libero has served in the current game in position three (in replacement of starting player No.8). Later in the same game, the libero, who is already on the court in replacement of No.10), moves to the right back position where player No.7 is the next correct server. Player No.10 enters the court, and player No.7 exits. The officials are aware that the libero cannot serve in this second position, but how should they handle the situation?

Ruling: The libero replacement is NOT legal, since the libero has not sat out a rally, and cannot legally serve next. Whenever a libero replaces a player without sitting out a rally, there are three possible outcomes: (a) the team corrects the error quickly on their own with no repercussions; (b) the officials intervene to correct the error and an unnecessary delay is charged; (c) if neither a or b occurs and a serve takes place with the libero illegally on the court, illegal alignment has occurred. Those options are appropriate in this situation, since the libero has illegally replaced player No.7.

Recording Libero Serving:

The libero can serve in one rotation by replacing the player who is in the service position and who would serve the next ball. When the libero serves, a triangle is used in the scoring sections in each part of the scoresheet where score is reflected. In the score sheet and libero tracking sheet, examples provided below, #5 is the libero.

1. **REQUIREMENTS:**

A. In order to be considered for tournament play, each school must meet the following schedule requirement:

- Maximum number of games - **18**
- Minimum number of games - 10

B. **COMPLETED SCHEDULE AND FORFEIT:**

All teams must complete their entire schedule submitted to the NHIAA. Any scheduled game(s) not played must be reported (in writing by both schools) to the NHIAA prior to the date of NHIAA pairings with an explanation. The Committee will determine if games not played will be considered a forfeit(s) or a no game(s). A team CANNOT forfeit a game to the other team under any circumstances.

C. **MAKE-UP GAMES:**

Make-up games may not be scheduled into the last week of the season. The only games that can be played during the last week of the season are games on the original schedules submitted to the NHIAA.

***Exception to Reschedule into the Last Week of the Season:** If for some reason, a game must be moved into the last week of the season a letter, prior to the game being played, must be submitted to and received by the Chair of the Committee through the NHIAA Executive Director by both schools outlining the reason(s) for the request.

****Please note** that any game moved into the last week of the season must be approved and played by the last date to play. No extension of the season will be granted. In the event the game(s) are not played both teams will be issued forfeit losses unless extenuating circumstances arise.

3. **PLAYING RULES:**

- A. Official National Federation Rules for Volleyball will be used in both regular season and tournament play.
- B. The Federation rule regarding uniforms will be followed.
- C. It is the recommendation of the NHIAA Volleyball Committee that the sub-varsity contest be played first with the varsity contest to follow.
- D. The NHIAA Volleyball Committee recommends the following pre-game schedule be used for both varsity and sub-varsity contests with a 3 (three) minutes transition period:
 - 3 (Three) Minutes - Transition Time
(Transition time = Time between the end of the junior varsity match and the beginning of the coaches/captains meeting of the varsity match.)
 - Coin Toss Held
 - 6 (Six) Minutes - Visiting Team/Lower Seed Warm-up
 - 6 (Six) Minutes - Home Team/Higher Seed Warm-up
 - 3 (Three) Minutes - Shared - No Serving

While one team is warming up, the other team should be doing no type of warm-ups in the gym where the volleyball court is located.
- E. The NHIAA Volleyball Committee has voted to use the following guidelines:
 - Varsity: Win by 2
 - 3 out of 5 (Rally)
 - Game to 25 Points
 - 5th Game to 15
 - Let Serve to Continue
 - JV: Win by 2
 - Play 3 games regardless of the outcome of games 1 and 2 (Rally)
 - Game 1 & 2 to 25 Points
 - 3rd Game to 15
 - Let Serve to Continue
- F. The game ball should have no marking or coloring added to it.

4. **REPORTING SCORES:**

It is important that all teams enter their scores on the web site, www.nhiala.org immediately following the game in order to ensure accurate and up-to-date standings.

5. All Varsity games are to be officiated by two (2) NHIAA registered officials. Exception to this may be sought by contacting the NHIAA Office and the opposing school before the contest. This should only be considered when no NHIAA registered official is available.

6. **TOURNAMENT SELECTION:**

Tournament team selection shall be determined in accordance with the present classification system.

Girls: The top sixteen (16) teams in Division I, II and III shall qualify for the state tournament.

Boys: An eight-(8) team tournament will be held.

In case of a tie for any of the tournament positions, the NHIAA tie-breaking procedure will be used.

7. **TIE-BREAKING:**

If there is a tie for any of the tournament positions, the NHIAA Tie-Breaking Procedure (By-Law Article XI) will be used.

8. **All tournament teams/rosters will be limited to a maximum of fifteen (15) players and a maximum of five (5) non players.**

9. **TOURNAMENT FORMAT:**

10. **TOURNAMENT OFFICIALS:**

The NHIAA Volleyball Committee, in accordance with established by-laws, will make recommendation of tournament officials.

11. **PEP BANDS:**

The Athletic Director shall call the NHIAA beforehand to allow preparation of seating for the pep band at the Tournament games at neutral sites.

Pep bands will be allowed to play at the tournament games held at neutral sites. Each Pep Band will be allowed a MAXIMUM of twenty (20) players. Band players will be admitted free of charge to the game in which their team is competing only when accompanied by an Advisor. Any additional members shall be charged admission at the normal rate.

Pep Bands will be assigned a seating location by the Tournament Director at the site. An advisor must be with the band at all times while playing. **Bands are not to play once the ball is put into play.**

***NOTE:** The National Anthem will be played prior to the first game in a session if more than one game is to be played that day. For the Championship Games, the National Anthem will be played prior to each game.

12. **SPECTATOR BEHAVIOR & NOISE MAKERS at Regular Season and Tournament Games:**

- The playing of musical instruments and/or amplified music while the game is in progress shall be prohibited. The only time that a game is not ‘in progress’ after it has started is during a time-out or during between periods and halftime (This includes bands).
- Possession and/or the use of artificial noisemakers is prohibited at all times during the NHIAA regular season and tournament games. The official interpretation of an artificial noisemaker is being any object that is used to manufacture noise, such as horns, bells and whistles, or by making contact with another object or surface.
- Spectators will not be permitted to run the sidelines to encourage spectator cheering.

13. **AWARDS:**

An official NHIAA Championship and Runner-up plaque, and twenty individual medals, will be awarded to the respective champion and runner-up teams in each class for both boys and girls.

14. **NFHS Authenticating Mark-GAME BALLS:**

All game balls at all levels of play shall have the NFHS Authenticating Mark imprinted.

The following procedure is to be followed:

- Prior to the start of the game the head official is to inspect the game ball(s) to ensure the NFHS Authenticating Mark is imprinted. If the home team's ball does not have the mark the visiting team's ball with the Authenticating Mark is to be used.
- In the event neither ball has the mark, the game is to be played and the head game official is to report the matter to the Supervisor of Officials, who in turn will notify the NHIAA office.

15. **FIFTY-FIFTY RAFFLE:**

Fifty-fifty raffles are permitted by the New Hampshire Interscholastic Athletic Association (NHIAA) at the site of an NHIAA member school hosting any round of an NHIAA tournament event. Students will not sell tickets.

Under no conditions will these raffles be permitted at "neutral" sites that are not NHIAA member school sites. i.e.: Pinkerton Academy (Semifinals and Final rounds), Plymouth State University

16. **PROTEST PROCEDURE AT STATE TOURNAMENTS:**

During State Tournament play **AT NEUTRAL SITES**, there shall be no appeals of protests to the Executive Director. All protests shall be resolved at the game site at the time of the protest and the Protest Committee will be made up of a representative from the NHIAA Volleyball Committee and the officials involved in the game. During State Tournament Play at the home of the higher seed protests shall be resolved by consulting with the Rules Interpreter who will be available via phone during prelim and quarterfinal contests.

17. **BLOOD SPILLAGE AND BODY FLUIDS:**

The NHIAA Sports Medicine Committee suggests that each school develop a local policy in cooperation with their local medical personnel, on how to handle blood spillage.

Housekeeping Procedures for Blood and Body Fluids

Disposable latex gloves should be worn to avoid contamination of the hands of the person cleaning spillages involving blood or other body fluids and secretions. Persons involved in cleaning contaminated surfaces should avoid exposure of open skin lesions or mucous membranes to blood or body fluids. A freshly prepared solution of dilute household bleach (one quarter cup of bleach diluted in one gallon of water) or other disinfectant labeled as *virucidal*, *Tuberculocidal*, *staphylocidal* is useful.

Allow the disinfectant to stand wet for a minimum of one minute to start killing pathogens and disinfecting the area (10 minutes of disinfection time guarantees surface sterility). Whenever possible, disposable towels, tissues, and gloves should be used and properly discarded and mops should be rinsed in disinfectant.

INTERPRETATION OF EXCESSIVE BLEEDING:

National Federation Rules call for a player, who is bleeding, has an open wound or excessive blood on the uniform, to leave the court/field.

The NHIAA interprets "excessive blood on the uniform" to mean that part of the uniform is saturated with blood. Saturated does not mean a wet spot. Saturated means a major portion of the garment is covered and soaked with blood. For this to occur, significant bleeding would have had to take place.

For any blood on uniform less than "saturated", the uniform does not have to be changed. School personnel have the responsibility of treating the blood area with the appropriate disinfecting solution

before the athlete may participate. If the uniform is "saturated" with blood, the uniform must be changed before the athlete may participate. This interpretation is to be followed in the conduct of all NHIAA athletic events.

18. **TOURNAMENT EVENT POSTPONEMENTS (WEATHER):**

- **Home of Higher Seed:** The decision to postpone a tournament game held at the home of the higher seed will be left to the discretion of the home site Game Director to make the decision to postpone and reschedule games to the next day. The officials and the NHIAA must be notified of the postponement and the reschedule date and time.
- **Neutral Site – During the Week:** The decision to postpone a tournament event during the week will be made by the NHIAA. Schools, Supervisor of Officials, Game Directors, Police and Trainers will be notified by the NHIAA.
- **Neutral Site – Weekends & Holidays:** The decision to postpone a tournament event on weekends and holidays will be made by the NHIAA. **SCHOOLS WILL NOT BE NOTIFIED.** It will be the responsibility of the schools playing to check the NHIAA website (visit www.nhiala.org and click on the “tournament info” link) or to call the NHIAA and listen to the Game Conditions line (call: 228-8671 and select the Game Conditions option.) The NHIAA will notify Game Directors, Supervisor of Officials, Police and Trainers. **TEAMS SHOULD NOT LEAVE FOR THE TOURNAMENT SITE UNTIL THE NHIAA WEBSITE AND GAME CONDITIONS LINE HAS BEEN CHECKED.**

19. **JEWELRY AND BODY PIERCING RULE:**

No jewelry, which includes body-piercing objects **and belts**, shall be worn. Religious or medical alert medals must be properly secured under the uniform. Also, any visible body and face paint and/or glitter is not allowed during regular season and tournament play. The penalty administered will be “unnecessary delay.” Permanent body tattoos will be exempt from this rule.

20. **PRE-GAME ATTIRE (IF ON THE COURT SURFACE) SHALL CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING:**

- a. Proper footwear for players (i.e. sneakers) No sandals, shoes, boots or bare feet are allowed.
- b. Jewelry and Body Piercing Rule shall be in effect

21. **SCRIMMAGES AND/OR JAMBOREES:**

All rules remain the same as they are administered and adhered to in the regular season and tournament play.

22. **BENCH PERSONNEL:**

For liability reasons Below Grade Nine (9) students/children are not allowed to be on the team benches or on the sidelines at any regular season or tournament contest.

*Exception- “Ball Shaggers” – Volleyball

- One (1) ball shagger per bench shall be allowed.

23. **TOURNAMENT GAME START TIMES:** Tournament match times will NOT be altered unless the first match runs into the start time of the second match.

24. **PROCESS FOR DEALING WITH DISQUALIFIED ATHLETES AT ALL ATHLETIC EVENTS:**

A disqualified athlete is not to be sent to the locker room or off the field **unsupervised**. If no supervision is available the disqualified athlete shall remain on the bench and become the coach’s responsibility to supervise.

2008-09 Volleyball Rule Changes

1-6-2 Prior to timed warm-ups, a conference shall be conducted with the head coach and captain(s) from each team.

Rationale: This change more accurately reflects what many states already permit by allowing more than one captain to attend the prematch conference as many teams have co-captains.

5 Replace all references to referee with first referee and replace all references to umpire with second referee.

Rationale: More accurately reflects the current terminology in the sport of volleyball.

5-1-1 Assistant officials include scorer, libero tracker, timer and line judges.

Rationale: The change of deleting any reference to assistant scorer to only libero tracker (LT) more easily identifies the position and its responsibilities.

5-8-4 By state high school association adoption, line judges may use flags.

Rationale: The opportunity to use flags continues. This change clarifies the state association shall have the responsibility to determine how the use of flags shall be implemented if they are used.

1. **Warm-ups**

Must bring own balls for warm-up at Plymouth State University
Practice balls will be provided at Pinkerton Academy

- Six (6) minutes - visiting team
- Six (6) minutes - home team
- Three (3) minutes - shared court- NO SERVING

2. **After Warm-ups (Championship Game)**

1. Both teams leave playing area - locker room.
2. Teams, managers and coaches are to line up and march in single file to the Olympic Theme Song.
3. Teams line up on the respective end lines by the team bench.
4. Players, coaches and managers will be introduced individually, step forward and wave upon being introduced.
5. The National Anthem will be played.
6. Teams return to their respective benches.
7. Starters return to court and line up on end line.
8. Officials bring teams to net for pre-game handshake.
9. Game begins.

3. **After Warm-ups (Prelims, Quarterfinals and Semifinals)**

Do numbers 3 - 9 as outlined above. Teams will not march into the gym at these rounds.

4. **Post Game Ceremony**

- After completion of game, both teams return to their benches and be seated.
- NHIAA Volleyball Committee will run the Awards Ceremony.
- Runner-up Coach will be called forward to receive the plaque. Remain at the center of the court. Players, managers and the other coach will be called forward to receive their medals. Remain standing as a group at the center court facing the spectators from your community.
- Upon completion, return to the bench to observe the Championship awards recognition.
- Repeat same as above for Championship team. Also, the game ball is to be given to the Championship coach at the same time the plaque is presented.
